## Dear Families:

I hope this update finds you well and filled with anticipation for the new possibilities that spring signals. As we work to finish the second semester strong and head into the home stretch of the academic year, I want to update parents on efforts underway to ensure the continued growth and well-being of our District.

In a letter sent to families on January 5, 2024, I noted that the District had experienced recent incidents of student bullying, harassment, hazing, and harm-causing, race-based behaviors within our school community. I further noted: 1) these actions go against the values and beliefs we hold dear at Mattawan; 2) it was disheartening to acknowledge their occurrence; 3) such behaviors will not be tolerated; and 4) that the District would be acting on several items to help address these concerns. The following are updates and next steps to this vital work.

The District has partnered with Marcy L. Peake, founder of The Center for Cultural Agility (see bio on next page). This partnership is an essential step in our commitment to fostering positive change and creating a more supportive learning environment and experience for our students. We have already begun collaborating with Ms. Peake on a variety of short-term action items, including:

- a comprehensive review of relevant policies and procedures related to bullying, harassment, and harm-causing, race-based behaviors;
- a collaborative review with building and department leadership teams of all student and athletic handbooks, as well as employee handbooks; and,
- an analysis of climate/culture data within our school.

Ms. Peake's role is to review, analyze, collaborate with, and offer her experience-driven feedback on our outcomes. As we move toward June, we will focus on a few additional goals, including:

- further perception data gathering and analysis from students if needed; and,
- recommendations for potential summer work or subsequent professional development.

We are dedicated to providing meaningful and age-appropriate learning experiences for our K-12 students and creating opportunities for our staff to come together for growth and excellence in their roles. Your support is greatly appreciated.
